In 2010 we received the highest distinction possible in our profession, the Society of American Archivists' Distinguished Service Award. We have achieved progress and developed (and effectively implemented) projects that are the envy of our profession and of benefit to our researchers, but done so on a relatively slim budget indeed. ## Why Support the AHC?

While many universities have manuscripts, archives, and university archives, very few have collections as extensive and significant as the AHC. The AHC is a premiere and internationally recognized archives and research center, bringing wide attention to UW and the State of Wyoming. The Center does much to support UW's commitment to national distinction, by attracting scholars from around the world. The AHC also supports UW's commitment to academic excellence by providing and assisting with a wide-range of quality courses and programs for students, in our efforts to offer personalized instruction and exceptional opportunities for research. Private support is crucial in ensuring that UW and the AHC remain competitive and continue providing quality educational and enrichment opportunities to UW's community and abroad.

## Giving to the AHC

More than 50% of funding for the AHC comes from private support, a combination of endowment income and annual gifts. In fact, private funds support 100% of our non-personnel expenses and 50% of our faculty and staff positions. We could not function without private gifts.

Therefore, gifts of all sizes are greatly valued and have an enormous impact on the work we do. Unrestricted annual fund gifts are critical to helping the AHC meet its daily needs by providing a dependable source of flexible funding for its many programs. Additionally, private annual donations make resources available when there is a sudden program need or a sudden opportunity (for example, to purchase important historical documents). Endowment gifts are just as critical to the sustainability of the AHC.

Endowments begin at \$25,000, and support professional positions and significant programs, such as History Day. Endowments can be formed through an outright gift of cash, charitable remainder trust or a charitable gift annuity. Endowments are crucially important to us, because of the income they produce each year. Equally essential, however, are trusts, annuities, and bequests. To take one example, a charitable remainder trusts can guarantee the donor a fixed income for life with substantial tax advantages, while ultimately benefiting the AHC.
