JOB PURPOSE:

At the college level, provide expert guidance and quality control to research faculty and staff regarding all facets of the contracts and grants processes. Initiate and oversee implementation of special projects. Research and interpret relevant regulations, guidelines, and standards, and oversee the processing of grants and/or awards. Provide technical leadership and functional guidance and training to lower-level grant coordinators as appropriate.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provide independent guidance and oversight to research faculty, staff and administration in the
 development and prep of proposals, contracts and agreements to include budgets, documentation
 and interpretation of funding requirements.
- Provide professional guidance and mentorship to research staff and grant coordinators.
- Review incoming research proposals for accuracy of structure, compliance with UW policies and procedures, conflict of interest and compliance.
- Guide and facilitate faculty and staff in the development and preparation of research proposals, awards, and agreements, to include budgets, documentation, and interpretation of funding requirements.
- Analyze and evaluate grant budgets for correct calculation of expenditure categories such as salaries, percent of effort, salary adjustment increases, fringe benefits, indirect costs, materials, and equipment.
- Analyze and evaluate awarded proposals, contracts, and subcontracts for compliance; approve or reject deviations from contract specifications, prepare acceptance documentation and obtain required approvals.
- Formulate processes and procedures for negotiation of contract and grant pre-awards and postawards to meet university requirements; research appropriate federal, state, and local requirements

to facilitate compliance by all parties; assist in arbitration and resolution of conflicting interests, as necessary.

- Coordinate receipt of awards and contract documentation; maintain proposal and funding records in database systems, and prepare scheduled and special reports, studies and analyses.
- Initiate and oversee implementation of special projects.
- Identify and pursue funding opportunities that will facilitate growth in interdisciplinary research.
- Perform some public relations duties pertaining to grants and research successes.
