University of Wyoming College of Education Block Articulation Guide Eastern Wyoming College – AAS Welding UW Bachelor of Applied Science in Career & Technical Education (CTE)

This block transfer guide identifies the credits needed to complete the University of Wyoming's (UW) College of Education Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) in Career & Technical Education (CTE) by separating courses into categories (blocks):

Block 1: University Studies Program (USP)

Block 2: Courses taken at Eastern Wyoming College (EWC) for the Associate in Applied Science (AAS) with a major in Welding

Block 3: UW Requirements for the major

Block 4: Teaching Endorsements

Transfer students with a qualifying AAS degree in Welding from Eastern Wyoming College (EWC) who meet the College of Education admission requirements and have a transfer GPA of 2.75 will be able to apply to transfer into the specified bachelor's degree program, ready to complete the remainder of their program at UW; allowing them to potentially graduate from the university in two years (four semesters) of full time enrollment.

Students should complete a minimum of 60 credits through their associate's degree coursework. Additional credits may be required to complete the USP block (Block 1).

Students should work closely with their academic adviser to plan their course of study to ensure that they complete the AAS degree as quickly as possible. Students should be prepared to take classes during the summers.

Notes: All students must successfully complete a background check within the first semester of starting the program
All students must obtain a Wyoming Substitute Teaching Permit in order to enroll and/or continue in this program
All students must complete the USP:Q component prior to graduation from UW; it is strongly suggested students successfully complete O mathematics course prior to beginning upper division coursework

Professional Education and CTE coursework are required for this program; sufficient CTE coursework must be transferred into UW and will be identified through the admission process

Block 1: USP (University Studies Program) Requirements

Students entering UW who have completed the AAS in Welding from Eastern Wyoming College will be required to complete the general education requirements of UW (USP) in order to earn the BAS in Career & Technical Education (CTE) degree. Many of these courses will be available to students while they are enrolled in their AAS degree program and are listed here. Specific courses taken to satisfy General Education requirements at EWC may not be specifically listed in this document, but are considered essential to prepare the student for entry into the Bachelor's degree program at UW.

Block 4: Teaching Endorsements

Students may elect to earn Teaching Endorsements in addition to their AAS degree.

Course requirements for the Teaching Endorsement(s) should be discussed with the student's academic advisor.

Articulation Notes

Degree Completion – Articulation Notes:

- Students may need to complete the FYS requirement if their associates degree was earned through concurrent enrollment as a high school student.
- Students transferring with an earned A.A.S. will need to complete USP requirements.
- Professional education courses taken any time prior to the last ten (10) years will not be accepted in a degree and/or teacher certification program.
- The College of Education does not accept transfer credits for Professional Education or content area courses with equivalents at UW when the grade earned was less than a C. Please note that grades of C- or lower will not satisfy this requirement.
- The College of Education does not accept either teaching methodology or student teaching coursework or credits completed at other colleges
 or universities.
- All students must complete the third writing component (C3) by completing EDSE 4277 (Methods CTE2) at UW, which is required for the BAS degree.
- This document represents curricular alignment between Casper College and the University of Wyoming for students matriculating at Casper College in the academic year 2021-2022 or later (a curricular change to the program at UW will require an update of this document).

B.A.S. Career & Technical Education (CTE) Teacher Education Initial Licensure - Program Notes:

- EDSE 4500 & EDSE 4550: These courses MUST be completed concurrently. They are offered only in the Spring Semester. Residency
 Application is required approximately ONE CALENDAR YEAR prior to entering Residency. It is critical for students to communicate
 regularly with their UW academic adviser for successful completion of these courses.
- A minimum of 120 credit hours is required (including transfer credit).
- A minimum of 42 hours must be upper division (3000 & 4000 level).
- Electives should be selected to satisfy the 42 hour upper division requirement.
- Degree Candidates must meet the academic requirements of the university, and must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 in all content courses required for the major.
- Grades of C or better are required for all prerequisite courses.
- Students may not take a Couse for S/U credit to satisfy any requirement, unless the course is offered for S/U credit only.

University of Wyoming Requirements (see http://www.uwyo.edu/registrar/university catalog/grad.html):

- Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from UW.
- Students may not take a course for S/U credit to satisfy any requirement, unless the course is offered for S/U credit only.
- A grade of C or above is required for University Studies Program (USP) FY, C1, C2, and C3.
- University Studies Program (USP), Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject but may be cross-listed with the major.
- No more than 4 semester hours of credit in physical activity courses can count toward the bachelor's degree.
- The UW minimum cumulative GPA requirement is 2.0.
- The UW Office of the Registrar provides final confirmation/approval of degree completion requirements prior to the awarding of any degree.
