**Meetings:** The UCRC Committee met monthly, generally on the third Thursday, from August 2023 through May 2024. All meetings were conducted over Zoom, which allowed for screen sharing when reviewing course action proposals (CAPs). Based on the number of CAPs during the 2022-23 academic year, the committee made the decision to increase the number of meetings and the length of time allotted for meetings.

- Started meetings in August for a business/planning meeting prior to the start of course action proposal review in September.
- Scheduled meetings for 3 hours (2-5pm) instead of historical 2 hours
- Additional supplemental sessions were still required in the fall semester to address the large number of course changes submitted for committee review.

**Course Action Proposal (CAP) Review:** The UCRC reviewed a total of 417 proposals in 2023-24, the vast majority of which were new or modified courses (which also requires a review of the accompanying course syllabus). See the table below for additional details and a comparison to academic year 2022-23. The specific courses reviewed and approved by the committee can be found in Appendix A, B, and C.

**Other Committee Action:** In academic year 22-23, a new electronic course review process with new timelines was implemented. This was a significant change across campus and for the UCRC. With two years of experience with the Modern Campus Curriculum (formerly Curriculog) system, the UCRC works closely with the Office of the Registrar to suggest minor adjustments to this system and associated processes to improve the course review process.

#### Created new processes/categories to facilitate easier course clean-up for colleges

- Mass Discontinuation. For colleges that have 3 or more courses to discontinue within a given unit, this can now be completed with one entry within Modern Campus Curriculum (formerly Curriculog) instead of multiple entries.
- <u>Course Hibernation.</u> Departments can be hesitant to delete courses; however, having courses visible in the catalog that will not be taught is confusing for students. Therefore, units can 'hibernate' a course, allowing it to remain in Banner, but not be listed in the Modern Campus Catalog (formerly Acalog).
  - Each September the Registrar's Office will provide units with a list of approved courses, the last time the course was taught, and any courses previously hibernated. Units can choose to place courses into hibernations or removed from this status. Courses that have been in hibernation for 7 years will be brought to the department's attention with a recommendation for discontinuation.

#### • Updates to Modern Campus Curriculum (Curriculog) system

- Tweaks to data entry fields and review of the Curriculog workflow have been made (e.g. what is best for individuals who originate a CAP, college reviews, etc.).
- Reviewed an updated Course Policy Guide created by the Registrar's Office to provide additional guidance for faculty/staff on timelines and processes for course action proposals (CAPs). This is posted on the UCRC website.
- Made recommendations to the Committee on Committees regarding committee membership and updating committee charge to no longer refer to a discontinued Uni-Reg.
