

OUTSTANDING FACULTY AWARD

Professor McLane came to the College of Law faculty in July 2018 after serving as a public defender, private practitioner, and innocence lawyer in Seattle, WA. She brought with her a substantial focus on practical teaching, emphasizing the need to better prepare law students for the actual practice of law while they are still in law school.

For her first five years at the College of Law, Professor McLane served as the faculty director for the Defender Aid Clinic, a student-led, faculty-supervised clinic focused on providing indigent criminal defense

representation in Wyoming. Professor McLane and her students appeared on behalf of clients in courts at all levels, including at the Wyoming Supreme Court numerous times. Professor McLane now serves in a more doctrinal role, teaching two of the College of Law's core courses—Torts to 1Ls and Evidence to 2Ls. In addition, Professor McLane continues to teach upper-level criminal justice seminars. Professor McLane's primary areas of research and scholarship are forensic science, policing, and mass incarceration in the criminal legal system.

David Singleton

City of Cheyenne Municipal Court Judge



David Singleton was raised in Cheyenne and attended Wyoming Technical Institute, where he earned an Associate of Applied Science degree in automotive technology. Judge Singleton earned a degree in political science with a minor in criminal justice at the University of Wyoming. His interest in law was piqued during a year spent working on political campaigns around Wyoming.

At the University of Wyoming College of Law, Judge Singleton met his long-time mentor, Professor Darrell Jackson, and became Professor Jackson's research assistant. His third year, he served as the student director for the College of Law Prosecution Assistance Program. In that role, he supervised student interns, drafted pleadings and briefs for county attorneys, and

argued twice before the Wyoming Supreme Court. Of all his law school experiences, he says the greatest was meeting his future wife, Kellsie Singleton.

After graduation, Judge Singleton went into private practice, representing a range of clients. He then joined the First Judicial District Attorney's Office as the HIDT (High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas) attorney prosecuting felony-level drug offenses in State and Federal Court and served as the Cheyenne City Prosecutor.

Judge Singleton has served on the Cheyenne Municipal Court since 2022 and for the last two years has also been an adjunct professor at the College of Law, teaching Civil Pretrial and Trial Practice.


