4-H sport fishing...

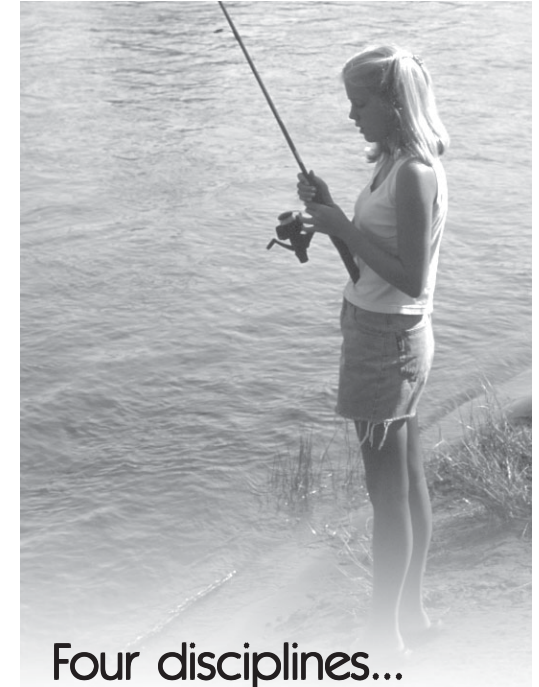
- a rapidly growing Wyoming 4-H project

4-H sport fishing goals ...

1. To provide a thorough introduction to fishing skills and safety
2. To provide proper training in the use of sport fishing and related equipment
3. To foster responsible fishing behavior
4. To encourage appreciation and understanding of nature, and commitment to natural resource stewardship
5. To expose participants to lifelong activities related to sport fishing
6. To strengthen families through participation in lifelong recreational activities
7. To provide knowledge of the ecological and social bases of fisheries management



This program helps to develop life skills in young people and adults while educating them to exercise leadership and support for responsible recreational fishing and stewardship of aquatic resources.
