CONTEST CLASSES & JUDGING

Judging classes for the contest will consist of the following categories:

6 Wool Classes (50 points per class):

- Targhee Breed Class
- ½ Blood Commercial Class
- Rambouillet Breed Class
- Columbia Breed Class
- Corriedale Breed Class
- ½ Blood Class

Wool Classes, Possible Points = 300

Written questions/answers on all six classes

Questions, Possible Points = 300

Grading Line (15 fleeces)

Grading, Possible Points = 225

Total possible points for the contest (all three categories) is 825

Contestants will be allowed 10 minutes for each judging class and 25 minutes for the Fleece Grading Line.

The 4-H Wool Judging Placings & Questions Card will be used for all judging classes. The Wool Grading Line Form will be used for the fleece classes. Cards and forms will be provided by the State 4-H Office.
