**THE PROGRAM OF STUDY FOR THE UNDERGRADUATE
MAJOR IN FINANCE**

Coursework prescribed to complete the Finance major is designed to provide the student with a strong understanding of how financial decisions are made and used within business. The coursework is applicable not only to students wishing to understand the financial management of business concerns, but also to students who might consider careers in government or the non-profit sector, or those who wish to someday become entrepreneurs. The curriculum is also structured to allow preparation for graduate school by appropriate selection of courses. Students may choose to specialize in bank management, corporate finance, applied investment management, or quantitative financial analysis or to choose subjects among these concentrations. Since financial markets are subject to economic principles, and because good financial decision-making is based on sound understanding of financial information, students choosing this major are required to study economics and accounting in addition to their finance courses.

This program has been formulated to meet the requirements of AACSB International (the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business), the University of Wyoming, and the College of Business.

Minimum requirements include:

- Minimum of 42 semester hours of junior/senior-level courses. 30 of the 42 hours must be earned from UW.
- 2.50 grade point average in all College of Business courses.
- 2.50 grade point average in all institution (UW) courses.
- 50% of the business credit hours must be from the University of Wyoming.
- Grade of C (C- is not acceptable) or above required for University Studies Program: FY, C1, C2, and C3.
- Grade of C (C- is not acceptable) or **above** required for common body of knowledge and major specific core courses.
- A maximum of 6 hours each at the freshman/sophomore and junior/senior-level military science may be applied to degrees in the College of Business.
- Grade of C (C- is not acceptable) or above in MGT 4800 and a passing score on the ETS standardized test for COB majors.
