This is a guide for course work in the major; actual course sequence may vary by student. Please refer to the online student degree evaluation. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the catalogs of their respective institutions and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly. • Academic plans and course schedules may need to be altered if ACT or Math Placement scores require a student to take Pre-College courses (e.g., MATH 0900, 0921, or 0925) before taking required math or English courses.

Casper College requirements:

In order to graduate, students must successfully complete a minimum of 60 credit hours, with 15 of the last 30 semester hours completed as a degree-seeking student at Casper College, and with a grade point average of 2.0 or higher in those courses counted toward graduation. • Students must earn at least 24 of the semester credits applied toward graduation through the completion of Casper College coursework, including at least six (6) hours with the desired major. • Only courses numbered 1000 or above can be used toward the degree.

University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U.

UW College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to UW's University Studies Program requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

UW International Studies Program Notes:

International Studies majors are encouraged to study abroad or do an internationally-focused internship. • The fall or spring semester of the junior year could be a semester to study abroad; in that case, the recommended courses sequencing should be taken the fall semester of the senior year.

* A single language must be taken for five (5) semesters to fulfill the **18 hour foreign language requirement** for the program. • Language courses must be conversational language courses; for this program of study, American Sign Language is not considered a foreign language.

a- **Areas of Focus.** Students will complete a minimum of 18 hours of coursework in two specific areas of focus, choosing a **global track** and a **regional track**. Students must complete a minimum of nine (9) hours in each track.

Global Tracks: Culture and Social Issues; Economic Systems; Governance and Conflict Resolution; and Sustainable Development & the Environment

Regional Tracks: Africa and the Middle East; Asia and the Pacific Rim; Europe and the Former Soviet Union; and Latin America.
