Students should review the course descriptions in the catalogs of their respective institutions and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly. • Academic plans and course schedules may need to be altered if ACT or Math Placement scores require a student to take pre-college courses (e.g., MATH 0900, 0921, or 0925) before taking required math or English courses.

Central Wyoming College requirements:

In order to graduate, students must successfully complete a minimum of 60 credit hours, with a minimum of 15 of the final 30 degree credits from Central Wyoming College. • All courses must be college-level courses as indicated by a number of 1000 or above. • A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better is required in all hours completed at CWC and in those courses required for graduation in a student's prescribed program. • A minimum of 2.0 (C) is required in general education course requirements and program requirements in the student's program of study. • An S/U graded course will not accepted to fulfill a general education or program requirement unless the course is offered S/U only.

University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for
