Please refer to the online student degree evaluation. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the catalogs of their respective institutions and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly. • Academic plans and course schedules may need to be altered if ACT or Math Placement scores require a student to take pre-college courses (e.g., MATH 0900, 0921, or 0925) before taking required math or English courses.

#### Eastern Wyoming College requirements:

In order to graduate, students must successfully complete a minimum of 60 credit hours, 15 of which must be applicable towards graduation from Eastern Wyoming College, with a grade point average of 2.0 or better in courses numbered 1000 or higher. • No more than six (6) hours in courses numbered 1490, 1990, 2490, or 2990 will apply toward the degree; in addition, no course offered under the Developmental Studies Department may be applied toward the degree.

#### University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from UW. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U.

This program has been formulated to meet the requirements of UW, the UW College of Business, and the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International. • A 2.50 cumulative transfer grade point average required. • A 2.50 grade point average is required in all College of Business courses. • A 2.50 grade point average is required in all UW courses. • 50% of business credit hours must be from UW. • A maximum of six (6) hours of freshman/sophomore-level military science and a maximum of six (6) hours of junior/senior-level military science may be applied to degrees in the College of Business.
