Successful completion of the 2+2 plan requires that a student remain continuously enrolled and graduate with the associate's degree from his or her respective community college. • This is a guide for course work in the major; actual course sequence may vary by student. Please refer to the online student degree evaluation. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the catalogs of their respective institutions and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly. • Academic plans and course schedules may need to be altered if ACT or Math Placement scores require a student to take pre-college courses (e.g., MATH 0900, 0921, or 0925) before taking required math or English courses.

Western Wyoming Community College requirements:

In order to graduate, students must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 (a "C" average) or better in all hours attempted at Western Wyoming Community College. • At least 15 credit hours must be completed through WWCC. • Developmental courses in math or English do not count toward the minimum 64 credits needed to meet degree requirements. • Generally, no courses taken from WWCC for S/U grades may be used for graduation hours. • Students may not receive credit for courses which are prerequisite to course they have already completed. • A maximum of six (6) hours of studies or workshop courses may be applied toward the Associates Degree. • A maximum of four (4) hours of internship may be allowed for AA or AS degrees.

University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. Transfer Recommendations and Program Notes can't on page 2.

UW College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to UW's University Studies Program requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

UW Psychology Program Notes:

A minimum of 33 hours in psychology are required for majors but the total cannot exceed 60 hours. • Eighteen (18) of these psychology credit hours must be at the 3000-level or above to graduate. Also, the upper division courses must be taken from at least two different members of the psychology department faculty listed in the *UW University Catalog*. • All major courses require a grade of C or better to graduate.

a Six (6) hours of **social science courses** from the disciplines of anthropology, communication/journalism, criminal justice, economics, political science, and/or sociology are required for the UW psychology major. ANTH 1200 and SOC 1000 are shown here as examples; other courses may be available. Please discuss with an academic advisor.

b **Introductory courses** in all five (5) of the psychology core areas (biological, social, developmental, clinical, and cognitive) are represented in this plan. However, courses in only four (4) of the five (5) areas are needed to meet UW degree requirements.

c One (1) approved three to four (3-4) credit hour **UW STEM** course is required from among the following: CHEM 1000, CHEM 1020, COSC 1010, COSC 1100, KIN/ZOO 2040, KIN/ZOO 2041, LIFE 2002, LIFE 2022, LIFE 2023, LIFE 2050, MATH 1050, MATH 1405, MATH 2200, MICR/MOLB 2021, PHYS 1050, PHYS 1110, STAT 2000, STAT 3050, or ZOO 3600.
