B.S. Agricultural Business, Farm and Ranch Management Program Notes:

This curriculum is for students intending to become operators or professional managers of farms, ranches or feedlots. It is also well suited for students interested in the field of agricultural finance, or a minor in biological fields such as agroecology or range management. In this option, courses in farm and ranch management, finance and marketing are supplemented by courses in crops, range management, veterinary sciences and animal science with electives in other areas.

- The major requires students to earn a minimum of 42 credits at the 3000 and 4000 level for graduation. At least 30 of the 42 credits must be earned from UW.
- **AG Econ:** Twenty four (24) credits in Ag Econ beyond those earned to satisfy the USP requirements. Eighteen (18) of these 24 credit hours must be at the 3000-4000 level.
- **PN:** Students can substitute CHEM 1000, CHEM 1020 or CHEM 1050. Credits earned in USP approved science courses offered within the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources shall also serve as Supporting Agriculture credits.

- Students may not take a course for S/U credit to satisfy any requirement, unless the course is offered for S/U credit only.

University of Wyoming Requirements

- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate.
- Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming.
- Courses must be taken for a single letter grade unless offered only for S/U.
- University Studies Program (USP), Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

College of Agriculture and Natural Resources

The Department of Agriculture and Applied Economics does not allow AG Economics (AGEC) or Economics (ECON) courses to fulfill the USP Human Culture (H) requirement. If pursuing a minor in the College of Business, a grade of C or better must be earned in coursework applying to the minor as well as an overall GPA of 2.5 or better.

- At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (individual majors may require more).

The University of Wyoming Office of the Registrar provides final approval of degree completion requirements prior to the awarding of any degree.
