B.A. Art History Program Notes:

B.A. in Art History Degree. The B.A. in Art History major offers students with a course of study that will provide depth and breadth in the history of art. Students will develop a broad understanding of world art, study the art of western and other global cultures in-depth, and explore the historiography and professional practices related to the field. Closely linked to the Museum Studies minor curriculum, the B.A. in Art History has a strong vocational application. This degree provides preparation for entry into graduate school or for students who want to enter the work force after their undergraduate education. Students will have the experience and training to enter into the cultural sector (arts or archival management, non-profit work in the arts and humanities, etc.).

- A minimum of 121 hours is required, 48 within the Art Major. A minimum of 42 hours must be upper division (3000 & 4000 level). All Art courses with a grade of C or better. 2.5 GPA within major and a 2.5 GPA overall.

Transfer Residency: A minimum of 26 hours of upper-division course work in the major is required to establish residency in the department for all transfer students. This applies to students in all five of the B.F.A., B.A., and Art Education degree programs who transfer in 12 or more hours of art courses for the major. Students in all art programs must meet the university requirement of at least 42 hours of course work at the upper-division level (3000- and above).

- Degree Candidates must meet the academic requirements of the university, and must have a minimum GPA of 2.0 in all courses required for the major.
- Grades of C or better are required for all prerequisite courses.

- **Language:** A single language must be taken for four (4) semesters to fulfill the 16 hour foreign language requirement for the program. American Sign Language does NOT fulfill the language requirement.

- **Upper Division Art History Electives:** Eighteen (18) hours of upper division art history classes are required. This includes 6-9 hours of upper division art history courses, 6 hours of which may be taken in other departments with cross listed courses.

- Students may not take a course for S/U credit to satisfy any requirement, unless the course is offered for S/U credit only.

College of Arts and Sciences Requirements

- Students must take two "core" courses in addition to UW's USP requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG).
- No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation.
- At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (individual majors may require more).

University of Wyoming Requirements

- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate.
- Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming.
- Courses must be taken for a single letter grade unless offered only for S/U.
- University Studies Program (USP), Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

The University of Wyoming Office of the Registrar provides final approval of degree completion requirements prior to the awarding of any degree.
