This is a guide for course work in the major; actual course sequence may vary by student. Please refer to the online student degree evaluation, and consult with an academic advisor. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the *University Catalog* and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly.

### University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. • University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

### College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to the USP requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

### Sociology Program Notes:

Thirty-five (35) hours are required to earn a major in sociology. This includes 14 hours of foundation courses, 12 hours of core courses, and nine (9) hours of sociology electives. • Grades of C or better must be earned in all 35 hours of coursework in order to be counted toward the major.

\* Requires MATH ACT  $\geq 21$ , MATH SAT  $\geq 600$ , Math Placement Exam  $\geq 2$ , or  $\geq C$  in Math 0921. (University standard)

\*\* Requires MATH ACT  $\geq 23$ , MATH SAT  $\geq 600$ , Math Placement Exam  $\geq 3$ , or  $\geq C$  in Math 0925. (University standard)

\*\*\*\* **Sociology Core Courses:** Complete one (1) course from any four (4) of the following areas (12 hours required from core courses):

**Area A: Society and Inequality:** SOC 2350 (Race & Ethnic Relations), SOC 3500 (Sociology of Gender), SOC 4050 (Social Inequality), and SOC 4160 (Sociology of Aging)

**Area B: Social Organization and Processes:** SOC 4020 (Sociology of Work), SOC 4500 (Sociology of Organizations), SOC 4650 (Urban Sociology), and SOC 4805 (Principles of Population)

**Area C: Social Institutions:** SOC 3140 (Sociology of the Family), SOC 3200 (Sociology of Religion), SOC 3605 (Sociology of Education), SOC 3880 (Political Sociology), and SOC 4350 (Sociology of Law)

**Area D: Individual and Society:** SOC 2400 (Criminology), SOC 3110 (Self and Society), SOC 3150 (Collective Behavior and Social Movements), SOC 3400 (Deviant Behavior), and SOC 4400 (Deviance and Social Control).

**Area E: Global Comparative Sociology:** SOC 3000 (Social Change), SOC 4110 (Sociology of International Development), SOC 4300 (The World System), and SOC 4370 (Global Political Economy).
