Students should review the course descriptions in the *University Catalog* and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly.

University of Wyoming Requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. • University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

College of Arts and Sciences Requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to the USP requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation (128 for professional programs). • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

Spanish Program Notes:

- A study abroad experience is highly recommended for the junior year and students should consider taking SPAN 3070 (Intensive Spanish Abroad) whenever it is offered in a summer semester. Consult with an academic advisor about which programs and courses to take in the sophomore year to prepare.

* Students majoring in Spanish: Language-Linguistics must take 31 semester hours of Spanish course work beyond SPAN 2030, which is taken in the third semester of the program. This includes the courses listed in the plan plus an additional 15 hours of electives above SPAN 2030.

** Spanish: Language-Linguistic majors are strongly encouraged to take the following two (2) electives:

- SPAN 3080 Spanish in the USA
- SPAN 4080 Fourth Year Spanish II

** To fulfill an upper division elective, Spanish: Language-Linguistic track majors may take one (1) class from the following five (5) courses offered by other departments:

- SPPA 3160 Language Development (formerly SPPA 4160)
- ANTH 4775 Language and Gender
- ANTH 4785 Language and Racism
- ANTH 4795 Language Change
- LANG 4785 Linguistics, Language Teaching and Social Context
