This is a guide for course work in the major; actual course sequence may vary by student. Please refer to the online student degree evaluation, and consult with an academic advisor. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the *University Catalog* and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly.

University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. • University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to the USP requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

English: English Studies Track Program Notes:

• All English Education majors will take the English Studies track.

* A **single language** must be taken for three (3) semesters to fulfill the 12 hour foreign language requirement for the program. • Students taking American Sign Language to fulfill the language requirement of the major will have to take other courses to fulfill the USP H requirements.

English: English Studies Track Program Notes con't:

**** English Requirement: Rhetoric/Composition/Professional Writing.** (9 hours) Course option vary by semester, but students in the English Studies track must take nine (9) elective hours from the list of Rhetoric/Composition/Professional Writing courses. • Consult with an academic advisor about available courses.

***** English Requirement: Expanding the Canon.** (6 hours) Course options vary by semester, but may include American Indian literature, Mexican-American literature, African-American literature, postcolonial literature, feminist theory, disability studies, and queer theory. • Consult with an academic advisor about available courses.

****** English Requirement: Historical Periods.** (9 hours) Students will take courses in three (3) of five (5) historical periods:

ENGL 3200	Topics in: Medieval Literature (3 hrs)	ENGL 3500	Topics in: 19th Century Literature (3 hrs)
ENGL 3300	Topics in: Renaissance Literature (3 hrs)	ENGL 3600	Topics in: 20th Century Literature (3 hrs)
ENGL 3400	Topics in: 18th Century Literature (3 hrs)		

Survey courses (ENGL 2425, ENGL 2430, and ENGL 2435) may also be used to fulfill these requirements.

******* Linguistics/History of the English Language Elective.** (3 hours) Choose one (1) course from the following:
