Please refer to the online student degree evaluation, and consult with an academic advisor. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the *University Catalog* and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly.

University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. • University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to the USP requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

Geography Program Notes:

In addition to course work required by the university and the college, majors must complete 40 hours of department requirements with a grade of C or better. • The department recommends that students consider a **study abroad experience**. Students should consider applying in the sophomore year for a one semester study abroad experience in the junior year.

- * A **single languag**e must be taken for two (2) semesters to fulfill the eight (8) hour foreign language requirement for the program. Students taking American Sign Language to fulfill the language requirement of the major will have to take other courses to fulfill the USP H requirements.
- ** Content Areas: Twenty-six (26) hours are to be distributed among a minimum of three (3) of the following areas, with a minimum of one (1) course in three (3) different areas and with at least two (2) courses in each of two (2) areas:
 - Human Geography
 - Physical Geography
 - Geographic Information Science (GIS)
 - Natural Resource Management
 - Planning

Courses which satisfy content area requirements are identified by the following codes which appear at the end of the course descriptions in the *University Catalog*: [H] human geography, [P] physical geography, [A] geographic information science, and [R] natural resource management. • Courses used to meet department requirements must be approved by the faculty advisor.
