This is a guide for course work in the major; actual course sequence may vary by student. Please refer to the online student degree evaluation, and consult with an academic advisor. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the *University Catalog* and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly.

### University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. • University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

### College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to the USP requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

### History Program Notes:

In addition to all university studies and college requirements, students majoring in history will complete a minimum of 36 credit hours in the major, including 15 hours of upper division history electives. Additional history courses may not exceed 50 total hours to complete degree requirements. • Only courses in which a grade of C or better has been earned may be used to satisfy major requirements. • The history major has considerable leeway in course selection. Because of the flexibility of the program, history majors are encouraged to choose a minor in consultation with their academic advisor.

### History Program Notes con't:

\* A **single language** must be taken for 12 hours or three (3) semesters to fulfill the foreign language requirement for the program. • Students taking American Sign Language to fulfill the language requirement of the major will have to take other courses to fulfill the USP H requirements.

\*\* The history major has considerable leeway in course selection. However, breadth of study across more than one culture area is required in order to achieve balance between UW-Western Civilization and non-Western Civilization topics. Therefore, all students are required to successfully complete courses in both Western and non-Western Civilization courses. The history curriculum is divided into two sections: List A consists of all non-Western Civilization history courses; List B consists of all US and Western Civilization history courses. All majors will be required to complete one (1) three (3) hour credit course from each list at the lower-division level (1000-2000) and at the upper-division level (3000-4000). All of these courses will count toward completion of lower and upper division course requirements.
