### University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. • University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

### Agricultural Communications Program Notes:

• The College of Agriculture and Natural Resources encourages study abroad experiences. Consider a study abroad program after the sophomore year.

a- Requires MATH ACT  $\geq 21$ , MATH SAT  $\geq 600$ , Math Placement Exam  $\geq 2$ , or  $\geq C$  in MATH 0921. (University standard)

b- Requires MATH ACT  $\geq 23$ , MATH SAT  $\geq 600$ , Math Placement Exam  $\geq 3$ , or  $\geq C$  in MATH 0925. (University standard)
