Note: The University of Wyoming requires a pre-college curriculum. The following requirements are expressed in units. A unit equals one year of study.

1. English/ Communication/ Language Arts: Four units or their competency-based equivalents are required, of which, at least three units must have a substantial writing component.
2. Mathematics: A minimum of four units, or their competency-based equivalents, are required; to include the concepts of a college preparatory Algebra I/ Algebra II/ Geometry sequence.
3. Science: Four units, or their competency-based equivalents, are required. One year must be from the physical sciences: physics, chemistry, or a college preparatory physical science course. Remaining years may be a combination of biological, life, physical, or earth/space science courses.
4. Foreign Language: Two years of the same Foreign Language.
5. Social Studies: Three years of Social Science.
6. Additional Course work: Two units or their competency-based equivalents are required, to be selected from fine and performing arts, social and behavioral studies, humanities, additional foreign language, or career-technical courses.
