The Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)

The Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) provides one award amount, 150% of resident tuition, and is available to students who are residents of a WUE participating state. Students are recognized with a WUE award using the grid criteria to the right including their cumulative high school GPA (4.0 unweighted scale) and composite ACT/SAT score. *WUE participating states include: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, and Washington.

To ensure Rocky Mountain Scholars and WUE consideration and eligibility students must submit all of their admission application materials and confirm enrollment by May 1. Rocky Mountain Scholars and WUE awards cannot be combined. Applications and confirmations received after May 1 will only be considered if funds remain available.
