SCHOLARSHIPS

Hathaway Scholarship

Provides merit and need-based awards to qualifying students, determined by a combination of GPA (4.0 unweighted scale), test scores, and completion of high school curriculum requirements. The merit scholarships are offered at three levels of support at UW.



Honors	\$3,360 per year	Minimum GPA 3.50 & ACT 25
Performance	\$2,520 per year	Minimum GPA 3.00 & ACT 21
Opportunity	\$1,680 per year	Minimum GPA 2.50 & ACT 19

Wyoming Scholars Award

Provides \$1,000 per year to students with a 3.5 GPA (4.0 unweighted scale) and a 25 ACT. This scholarship is in addition to any Hathaway Honors Scholarship award received. To ensure Wyoming Scholars Award consideration, you must submit all of your admission application materials, be admitted to UW, and confirm your enrollment by May 1.

Trustees' Scholars Award

Provides a limited number of scholarship awards to top performing students. Recipients are evaluated on their academic excellence (high school GPA, test scores and curriculum rigor). This scholarship combined with the Hathaway Honors award provides the cost of tuition and mandatory fees (18 credit hours per semester, excluding summer sessions), double occupancy room, and unlimited meal plan. To ensure Trustees' Scholars Award consideration, you must submit all of your admission application materials by December 1 and confirm your enrollment by May 1.

College of Agriculture and Natural Resources

- CEAS Awards more than 375 merit-based scholarships per year.
- Nearly 78% of graduates report a starting salary greater than \$60,000 annually, and 89% report a starting salary greater than \$50,000 annually.
- Since 2012, UW has enjoyed privileged access to the NCAR-Wyoming Supercomputing Center. It represents a \$100 million public private-federal facility investment and is one of the world's fastest big-data computers.
