Saturday: March 3


10 am – 12 pm

Kick off a month-long arts celebration with this family-friendly event. Learn how to look at and talk about art with your family. Try out one or all of the no-cost art making activities. Museum curators, teaching artists and volunteers will be on hand to help you in both the Shelton Studio and Museum Studio make one of a kind artwork and creative projects and guide discussions in the galleries.



Come for a bit or stay the whole time! We provide light dinner while it lasts, so come early.

During Night at the Museum we will also unveil Family Activity Boxes (FAB) for the *43rd Annual Juried UW Student Exhibition*. These little black boxes are chocked full of great art making activities you can do in the galleries while looking at the

artwork, suggestions and games to play with each other, and even vocabulary words to learn together.

If you can't come to Family Night at the Museum, Family Activity Boxes will be available for self-guided tours and activities throughout the duration of the exhibition.



AFTERSCHOOL ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

Students in grades 1-3 may participate in a free after-school program at the Art Museum called Imagine Learning from the Masters. This program is made possible through a partnership with Albany County School District #1 and uses original art work in the UW Art Museum to enhance students' art, writing, thinking and speaking skills.

Students will have the opportunity to sign up for the program through their elementary school. Each program meets for seven consecutive sessions (Monday through Thursday) from 3:30-4:45 pm and follows the Art Museum's model of inquiry - observe, question, explore, create and reflect. These dynamic classes engage students in essential learning activities in ways that are fun and creative. They will work with professional artists and writers and a master teacher on writing and art skills, using art on exhibit as a starting point for their own ideas and creative processes.

Students are bused to and from the Art Museum courtesy of Albany County School District. **Contact your elementary school art teacher for information on how to participate.**

Unfortunately, this will be the last year of school district partnership funds for the afterschool enrichment program. Due to state cutbacks in transportation, bussing will no longer be available for Imagine Learning from the Masters. As the Art Museum investigates future options, we would like to invite your feedback. We value a strong partnership with the school district and local schools and see this as an opportunity to come up with an exciting new program. We need your help to make it the best it can be!
