Notes

- Arts and Sciences Undecided (ASUN) major is recommended for students interested in the humanities and/or social sciences and would like to be on track to graduate in four years, but are undecided in a specific major. The ASUN major allows students to complete all USP (except upper level writing) and A&S core requirements (except 9 hours of upper division) in four semesters, while exploring possible A&S humanities or social science majors and declare at the end of fourth semester.
- The order in which these requirements are met as well as the specific courses chosen to meet them will vary from student to student and may be impacted by many things, including: previous college credit earned through AP or IB classes, as well as “concurrent enrollment” classes, any classes previously taken at any institution of higher learning or summer school enrollment; areas of interest or possible majors or minors being considered; credit load desired for each semester, etc.
- In order to provide the ability for students to graduate in four years, it will be important to assist with student enrollment in key courses the first semester. Therefore, it is recommended that students are pre-enrolled in A&S 1000, LIFE 1002 and POLS 1000 as part of SureStart, but have the option of opting out of any or all of these three classes. To assist with developing a learning cohort or community it is also recommended ASUN students enroll in specific sections COJO 1010 in the spring of the first year.
- Courses outlined above are only a suggested path for undecided Arts and Science students. Students are allowed to substitute other USP courses for the ones outlined; however, all substitutions should be done in consultation with an advisor.

- Students who may be interested in a more scientific track should take MATH 1400 instead of MATH 1000 and should take LIFE 1010 and CHEM 1020 as their two science courses.
- Students who may be interested in Communications and Journalism should enroll in COJO 1000, COJO 1040 and COJO 2100 as their Humanities/Social Science electives in order to meet specific departmental requirements.
- Students who may be interested in Geography should take GEOG 1000 as one of their Humanities/Social Science electives as well as GEOG 1010 as one of their lab science requirements.
