The first view of the degree evaluation begins to tell you some important information.

- Your advisor is listed, and can be emailed by clicking on the name.
- The top section is a summary of your requirements; pay careful attention to the 120 credits required to graduate. As you progress through your studies, you'll want to be sure to complete the 120 in the timeframe you anticipate to complete your degree. The credits applied number tells you how close you are to achieving the 120 total.

All students must declare their intent to graduate in writing to the Office of the Registrar and pay the diploma fee of \$25 for each degree. Even if this requirement is showing complete, you may still need to submit an Anticipated Graduation Date form under the following conditions: 1. You have declared a second degree and have only submitted one form. 2. You have paid your graduation fee, but have not submitted an AGD form; 3. You have rented commencement regalia or completed the commencement survey but have not submitted an AGD form; or 4. You were up for graduation but did not graduate that semester. Any of these scenarios will require an updated AGD form. Check your 'Anticipated Graduation Date Information' on WyoWeb for more details.

Scrolling down, you will see the requirements for the major and for the college core. Note that clicking on the class link will enable a pop-up screen that will provide a course description, prerequisites needed, and schedule planning features. Also notice that any courses you've taken, or in which you're currently enrolled, will populate into the degree evaluation.

Major in Criminal Justice

All courses within the major must be completed with a grade of C or higher. CRMJ courses taken 6 or more years ago will not be used to satisfy degree requirements.
