SUBJECT: ASUW Senate Resolution 1380, transfer pre-registration

On October 14, 1980, the ASUW Steering Committee referred Senate Resolution 1380 to the Dean of Students with a request for information about the subject. Pursuant to that request, I can provide the following at this time:

1. The most difficult problems with an immediate and complete implementation of this proposal would be: (a) securing academic advisors to be available during the summer period to advise advanced students; and (b) securing complete and accurate records/advisor's folders for available advisors in a timely fashion.
2. An increase in the number of participants in summer orientation sessions will possibly necessitate an increase in the number of sessions offered, which will require an increase in personnel and other resources to conduct the sessions.
3. The Office of Registration and Records is presently working toward the objective proposed in Senate Bill 1380, and it is planned that a trial effort in this regard will be effectuated with one of the community colleges very soon.
