1. Be it resolved by the Student Senate of the Associated Students of the
2. University of Wyoming that whereas, we the Students of the University of
3. Wyoming are committed to world peace, freedom, democracy and quality, and
4. whereas, under the present government of El Salvador over 9,000 civilians
5. have been killed during 1980, and whereas, over 85% of the dead were killed
6. by government forces, and whereas, the recent deaths of American citizens
7. further demonstrates the inability of the government to control its armed
8. forces, and whereas, the ruling junta is supported only by the force of U.S.
9. arms, and whereas, the Democratic Revolutionary Front is supported by
10. religious, labor and other popular groups, that we demand an end to all U.S.
11. military and economic aid to the government of El Salvador; all U.S. military
12. advisors should immediately withdraw from El Salvador; and the U.S. should
13. immediately break diplomatic relations with the junta ruling El Salvador.
