

SENATE RESOLUTION #1767

Title: UW Move-Out Policy

Date: February 7, 1994

1 WHEREAS, the aim of the departments of Housing and Residence
2 Life and Food Service is to provide clean, comfortable, and
3 economical services to students; and

4 WHEREAS, the departments of Housing and Residence Life and
5 Food Service must not only cover their own costs, but must
6 also meet other financial obligations to the University of
7 Wyoming; and

8 WHEREAS, the current University of Wyoming Residence Hall/Food
9 Service Contract, which requires a buyout provision of 100% of
10 room and 75% of board, leaves students who are unhappy with
11 their conditions very few options; and

12 WHEREAS, the departments of Housing and Residence Life and
13 Food Service may not provide the necessary environment for
14 every individual student at UW; and

15 WHEREAS, the ratio of students that leave the residence halls
16 is consistent year after year; and

17 WHEREAS, it is not feasible for all students to explore the
18 various living arrangements in Laramie prior to the start of
19 school;

20 THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Student Senate of the
21 Associated Students of the University of Wyoming, that for a
22 year-long contract the departments of Housing and Residence

23 Life and Food Service charge 60% of the year's bill in the
24 Fall, and 40% in the Spring, and switch to a \$400 liquidated
25 damage fee rather than the current 100% buyout provision.
26 THEREFORE, be it further resolved by the Student Senate of the
27 Associated Students of the University of Wyoming, that a
28 single semester contract with current buyout provisions be
29 made available to those students who demonstrate that they
30 will not be at the University of Wyoming for more than one
31 semester.
