

Senate Resolution #1645

Title: Tuition Increase
Date: October 10, 1989
Sponsors: Academic Affairs Committee

1. Whereas there is a need to generate revenue at the University of Wyoming
2. to enhance the quality of education at the University; whereas the
3. students of the University of Wyoming recognize their role in generating
4. such revenue; whereas a higher quality education would increase the
5. value of degrees earned at the University; whereas students at the
6. University would support a tuition increase to reach this goal; and
7. whereas it is recognized that the economic needs of students must also be
8. taken into consideration; be it resolved by the Student Senate of the
9. Associated Students of the University of Wyoming that it support a one-
10. time tuition increase not to exceed 10 percent for the 1990-91 school
11. year for residents and non-residents conditional upon this extra revenue
12. being directed toward faculty and staff recruitment, retention, and
13. salaries. Be it further resolved that the ASUW feels tuition increases
14. should be implemented only as a last resort and alternative sources of
15. revenue generation should be looked into both this year and in future
16. budgetary proposals.
