

Senate Resolution #1760

Title: Tuition Assessment Realignment
Date: November 19, 1993

Sponsors: Senators Jarvis, Krug, Todd, Whitfield

1 WHEREAS, there presently exists a great inequity in the
2 tuition assessment between fees paid by the part-time and
3 full-time students; and

4 WHEREAS, the modifications to the tuition assessment proposed
5 by the Administration would solve this inequity between fees
6 paid by part-time and full-time students; and

7 WHEREAS, said modifications would create a separate inequity
8 between fees paid by resident and non-resident graduate
9 students; and

10 WHEREAS, the 1994 base model proposed by the Associated
11 Students of the University of Wyoming Student Senate would
12 maintain equity between fees paid by part-time and full-time
13 students; and

14 WHEREAS, the 1994 base model proposed by the Associated
15 Students of the University of Wyoming Student Senate would
16 create equity between fees paid by resident and non-resident
17 graduate students; and

18 WHEREAS, the President of the University of Wyoming has
19 decreed that any modifications to the tuition assessment shall
20 maintain budget neutrality; and

21 WHEREAS, the 1994 base model proposed by the Associated
22 Students of the University of Wyoming Student Senate would
23 create \$266,291.50 in additional revenue;

24 THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Associated Students of the
25 University of Wyoming Student Senate that we recommend that
26 the Administration of the University of Wyoming adopt the 1994
27 base model as proposed by the Associated Students of the
28 University of Wyoming Student Senate for future tuition
29 assessment (see addendum).


