

SENATE BILL #1939

Title: ASUW Funding for Program Advisor and Programming

Date: February 18, 2000

Authors: President Hammons, Vice President Keizer, Senator Eicke

Sponsors: Senators Eicke and West

1. WHEREAS, the Student Government of the Associated Students of the
2. University of Wyoming has identified as a priority and responsibility the
3. maintenance of budgetary efficiency and flexibility; and
4. WHEREAS, the continued and increased funding of positions inhibits the ability
5. to address student needs from year to year; and
6. WHEREAS, the current authority for the position of Program Advisor falls under
7. the Director of the Wyoming Union; and
8. WHEREAS, ASUW currently funds 100% of the salary and benefits for the
9. Program Advisor (a total allocation of \$30,350.00); and
10. WHEREAS, the Union Board has expressed a willingness to fund no greater than
11. \$16,600.00 of the Program Advisor's position for FY 2001, and to fund the
12. position in its entirety by FY 2003; and
13. WHEREAS, the student body has consistently expressed interest in increased
14. student programs and activities; and
15. WHEREAS, the Wyoming Union is currently contributing financial support for
16. the service and programming of ASUW in an effort to meet these needs.
17. THEREFORE, be it enacted that the Associated Students of the University of
18. Wyoming Student Government discontinue 50% of the funding for the Program

19. Advisor's position (\$15,175), up to a potential \$16,600.00 for FY 2001, as to be
20. decided by the ASUW Budget and Planning Committee according to salary
21. increases.
22. THEREFORE, be it further enacted that the Associated Students of the University
23. of Wyoming Student Government makes the recommendation to the Associated
24. Students of the University of Wyoming Student Government of 2000-2001 and
25. 2001-2002 that the funding for the remaining portion of the Program Advisor's
26. position be discontinued by the FY 2003 budget; and
27. THEREFORE, be it further enacted that the funds previously appropriated for the
28. Programs Assistant Advisor's salary be reallocated by the Associated Students of
29. The University of Wyoming Budget and Planning Committee for the FY 2001
30. budget with first priority given to increased programming; and
31. THEREFORE, be it further enacted that the above changes shall be held
32. contingent upon approval of the Wyoming Union Board of Directors.
