**Title:** Election By-Law Changes

1. WHEREAS, Senate Bills #1973, #1974, and #1975 change the election rules
2. stated in the Constitution; and
3. WHEREAS, the Constitution and By-Laws must agree.
4. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Associated Students of the University of
5. Wyoming that Article III, Section F, Subsection 1 of the ASUW By-Laws be
6. amended as stated in Addendum A; and
7. THEREFORE, be it further enacted by the Associated Students of the
8. University of Wyoming that Article III, Section F, Subsection 2 be amended
9. as stated in Addendum B; and
10. THEREFORE, be it further enacted by the Associated Students of the
11. University of Wyoming that Article III, Section C, Subsection 6 be amended
12. as stated in Addendum C.

## **ADDENDUM A**

1. A candidate for Senator must meet the following requirements:
  - a. He must be a full-time student.
  - b. He must have and maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average as an undergraduate and a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average as a graduate or professional student (unless the program does not require it).
  - c. He must submit an application provided by the ASUW Election Committee (available in the ASUW Office).
  - d. He must have completed not less than thirty (30) hours of University credit at the beginning of the academic year of his term of office.

## **ADDENDUM B**

2. A candidate for President or Vice-President must meet the following requirements:
  - a. He must be a full-time student.
  - b. He must have and maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average as an undergraduate and a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average as a graduate or professional student (unless the program does not require it).
  - c. He must submit an application provided by the ASUW Election Committee (Available in the ASUW Office).
  - d. He must have completed not less than sixty (60) hours of University credit by June 10 of the calendar year in which he was elected as an undergraduate student, or, as a graduate or professional student, he must have completed not less than eighteen (18) hours of University of Wyoming credit by June 10 of the calendar year in which he was elected unless he completed his undergraduate degree at the University of Wyoming.

## **ADDENDUM C**

6. In the event that a primary election is held, the number of candidates shall not exceed twice the number of senators for that college unless there is a tie for last place in that college, in which case all candidates will be allowed in the general election.

## **CURRENT BY-LAWS**

### **Article III**

#### **C.**

6. The number of candidates shall not exceed twice the number of senators for that college unless there is a tie for the last place in that college, in which case all candidates will be allowed in the general election.

#### **F. Candidates:**

1. A candidate for Senator must meet the following requirements:
  - a. He must be a full-time student.
  - b. He must have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average if an undergraduate, 3.0 cumulative grade point average if a graduate or professional student, unless such a cumulative grade point average is not required by his particular graduate or professional program.
  - c. He must submit an application provided by the ASUW Election Committee (available in the ASUW Office).
2. A candidate for ASUW President or Vice President must meet the following requirements:
  - a. Only a full-time undergraduate or law student with a 2.0 cumulative grade point average, or a full time graduate student with a 3.0 cumulative grade point average shall be eligible. Undergraduate students must have attained junior class standing or higher the semester following the election to be eligible.
