

SENATE BILL #2028

Title: Concerts and Convocations Long-Term Fee Plan

Date: February 5, 2003

Authors: Budget and Planning Committee

Sponsors: Senators Baugh, Dagit, James, McKee, Praeuner, and Stahley

1. WHEREAS, it is no longer feasible to fund the Concerts and Convocations
2. Committee from the ASUW Reserve; and
3. WHEREAS, a secure source of funding for the Concerts and Convocations
4. Committee should be established; and
5. WHEREAS, according to the 2001 ASUW Student Opinion Survey, 68.5% of
6. students felt that ASUW should fund the Concerts and Convocations
7. Committee and 61.9% had attended concerts put on by the Committee; and
8. WHEREAS, students desire popular entertainers and exposure to a variety of
9. accomplished speakers and lecturers; and
10. WHEREAS, such entertainers and speakers make the University of Wyoming
11. more attractive in recruiting and retaining students.
12. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Student Senate of the Associated Students
13. of the University of Wyoming that a fee of \$5.00 be implemented for FY'05
14. (Fall 2004); and
15. THEREFORE, be it further enacted by the Student Senate of the Associated
16. Students of the University of Wyoming that following the Student Affairs
17. fee schedule, the Concerts and Convocations fee shall be reevaluated by the
18. Budget and Planning Committee for FY '08; and

19. THEREFORE, be it further enacted by the Student Senate of the Associated
20. Students of the University of Wyoming that a dedicated reserve account shall
21. be established for any excess revenues realized from Concerts and
22. Convocations for their future use; and
23. THEREFORE, be it further enacted by the Student Senate of the Associated
24. Students of the University of Wyoming that the committee structure
25. described in Senate Bill #1878 shall be retained.
