

SENATE BILL #2202

Title: Dissolving the Special Committee on Parking and Transportation

Date: March 24, 2008

Sponsors: Senators Heimann, Jensen, Wold and Executive Cowger

1. WHEREAS, the Student Senate of the Associated Students of the University of
2. Wyoming passed Senate Bill #2173 to create a special committee on parking and
3. transportation; and
4. WHEREAS, Senate Bill #2173 charged the Special Committee on Parking and
5. Transportation with three purposes to 1) provide comments and recommendations to the
6. University of Wyoming Transportation Committee, 2) research parking issues impacting
7. students on campus, and 3) explore opportunities to alleviate parking difficulties in the
8. City of Laramie permitted areas; and
9. WHEREAS, the University of Wyoming hired the transportation consultant Stantec in
10. fall 2007 to conduct research and submit a proposal to the University of Wyoming; and
11. WHEREAS, the proposal submitted by Stantec to the University of Wyoming covers in
12. details the three functions of the special committee on parking and transportation; and
13. WHEREAS, Senate Bill #2173 states that the special committee on parking and
14. transportation shall not dissolve sooner than the 2008-2009 academic year.
15. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the student senate of the Associated Students of the
16. University of Wyoming (ASUW) that the Special Committee on Parking and
17. Transportation be dissolved on August 25, 2008; and
18. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that the ASUW Director of Transportation

19. Services/Transportation Coordinator who oversees the operation of the ASUW
20. SafeRide program be charged with conducting semi-annual meetings with Transit and
21. Parking Services (TransPark) to engage in dialogue regarding the current and future
22. parking and transportation issues at the University of Wyoming.


