<u>New RM project</u> The Rocky Mountain Herbarium (RM) continues its leadership role in Rocky Mt. region floristic studies. The RM recently



secured funding from the U.S. Forest Service to conduct a floristic inventory within the Nez Perce-Clearwater National Forests in Idaho. This project will focus on the northern portion of the forest, what was known as the Clearwater NF before that forest management unit merged with the Nez Perce NF. The project will be the first formal floristic inventory for this area and will document the existing native and introduced vascular plant flora, and provide and updates for species of conservation concern. The field work for the project will begin in May 2016, and will be based out of Grangeville, ID. We are recruiting a new Masters degree graduate student to take on this project for their research project. As with all floristics projects run out of the RM, a complete set of mounted voucher specimens will be place in the RM.
