The Infant Room has been exploring many different materials from our natural environment! We have explored water, pinecones, pine needles, grass, rocks and tree stumps. Water has been the children's main focus these past few weeks and they have enjoyed exploring it in many different ways using a variety of tools. One of their favorite water activities include scooping and pouring water in to the gutters on the water wall and then watching it move through the different sections of the wall, then doing it all over again. Another favorite activity is exploring water using sponges. The children are enthralled with the way the water drips out of the sponges when lifted out of the water, as well as when they squeeze it out using their hands. We plan to continue to support their interest with water throughout the summer, as well as their interest in buses and trucks. We plan to also include some different sensory experiences with dirt and flour throughout the next month.

TODDLER 1: CHRISTY



As the weather changes and gets warmer we are enjoying spending a majority of our time exploring our surrounding community. Thus far we have visited the UW track, tree area around the track, and Prexy's Pasture. While on these adventures the children spend their time hunting together for bunnies, bears, worms, and ants. If we just so happen to find any sort of wildlife, as a class we make sure to take extra care of one another as well the creatures we find. As the summer continues, we are looking forward to visiting the dinosaur museum and UW football field.

TODDLER 2: SHAILA

The children in Toddler 2 have many different interests. They are beginning to discover who they are and what they enjoy doing. As teachers we are observing what they are doing in the classroom and making connections between their activities and trying to understand what they are interested in and why they may be showing interest in those activities and objects. Right now the children are showing strong interest in dramatic play and dinosaurs. Throughout the summer we will be adding and exchanging dress-up clothes and other props to the classroom so the children can further explore taking on different roles and acting out different characters. They enjoy acting out playing dinosaurs. They especially like to roar and stomp like dinosaurs. We hope to foster both of these interests and any other interests the children may show this summer.



PRESCHOOL 1: JACLYN



Many emerging interests have surfaced in P1 this summer! The interest that keeps resurfacing is experimentation with light and shadows. Our first observation of the kid's interest in lights and shadows came when the children were using flashlights to look through jars. The experiment quickly turned into looking at what types of shadows we could make with our bodies! This led us to try tracing shadows of our bodies on large paper and then decorating them with natural materials.

Since tracing our own shadows, we have used the overhead to look at transparent shapes projected on the wall, shadows of felt animals/people/cars etc., and shadows of cup structures! We are excited to keep experimenting with the different things we can learn about the effect that light has on creating different types of shadows/projections! Page 3
