

Area of Concentration

Option 2: International Education Studies OR American Cultural Diversity

To fulfill requirements for the area of concentration in International Education Studies OR American Cultural Diversity, students must complete 18 credit hours of coursework selected from the following Core Areas. All courses must be passed with a grade of C or better. Students are encouraged to include a summer or semester UW sponsored study abroad course as part of the 18 credit hours. Opportunities are available through international studies advisers and the International Programs Office. **Study abroad credits will count toward the 18 hours of coursework in all of the following Core Areas.** Students who have been continuously enrolled at UW or a Wyoming Community College prior to fall 2000 are required to complete 21 credit hours of coursework in all areas of concentration.

Core Area One: International Studies Minor In order to receive a minor in International Studies students are required to take a total of 20 hours as outlined below. Students may choose to take a total of 18 credit hours from either of the following two options to meet requirements for the area of concentration without receiving a minor in International Studies.

- ❖ Option One: Twenty hours in approved international studies courses, including at least 8 hours in a foreign language and 12 twelve hours in a concentration. (Contact IS director, Dr. Manuela Hofer-McIntyre for selection of courses.)
- ❖ Option Two: Twenty hours in approved international studies courses, including at least 12 hours in a concentration and 3 hours from each of the core sections. (Contact IS director, Dr. Manuela Hofer-McIntyre for selection of courses.)

Core Area Two: Foreign Language Focus Eighteen credits of a **single** foreign language and associated elective courses, including American Sign Language. Students can obtain a minor in a foreign language by completing a program of 18 semester hours above 2030 (refer to general bulletin for selection of courses).

Core Area Three: American Cultural Diversity Focus Eighteen credits selected from the following lists. Advisors must approve selected courses.
