14	Wyoming academic calendar and the completion of graduate-level thesis research and
15	writing; therefore,

17	BE IT ENACTED by the Faculty Senate of the University of Wyoming to revise UW
18	Regulation 6-805, "Definition of Concurrent Majors, Dual Degrees, Second Bachelor's
19	Degree, Interdisciplinary Affiliated Programs, and Minors," to allow students in <u>DUAL</u> joint
20 21	degree programs with the College of Law who have completed the requirements of the J.D. to receive the J.D. one full academic term (Spring or Fall) before completion of the final
22	requirements for their second degree program, as presented in the attached addenda.
