Awards will be made based on academic performance, extracurricular merit, and financial need. Applicants must be officially declared in ORTM to be considered for this award. The application deadline is **February 15**.

Haub School Research and Creative Activities Grant Proposals

This grant, offered three times each year, is available to undergraduate and graduate students to support student research or creative activities related to the environment or natural resources.
