Insects should be packaged in a manner that ensures they arrive in good condition. Insect samples mailed in envelopes are often damaged and unrecognizable when they arrive. As of 4/6/2021, please send insect, spider, tick, and mite samples to my home address, it is much quicker that way. If sending a sample in alcohol please put it in a plastic bag it to prevent any leakage from escaping the package. I do not charge for the identification service.

A way to get a quicker ID is to first send good <u>in-focus photos</u> of it to: <u>insectid@uwyo.edu</u> or 307-399-9344 (photos sent via cell phones will often be reduced in resolution making it hard to see details). If I can't identify from the photos I will ask for a specimen(s).
