# Greetings DKH PETE Alumni,

It seems no matter where we travel in these United States, we are able to meet up with wonderful UW grads. In April I attended the AAHPERD conference in Charlotte, NC. Imagine how much fun I had sharing time and conversation with Craig Higgens (Class of 2004) who has been almost a decade teaching at an elementary school just north of Charlotte. However, if an on-site traditional interview, wherein the candidate talks to the interview committee, is the only part of the process then our recent graduates too often, in my opinion, are not hired. It seems to me that our novice teachers are unable to speak with as much fluency as do candidates who have several years of teaching experience. If, however, all candidates are allowed the opportunity to actually teach a class of children, the UW novice teachers often outshine even more experienced teachers. This is all just my observation and opinion. But I encourage those of you teaching in schools to not only become part of hiring committees, but also promote the inclusion of a short teaching episode in the interview process.

<u>Please provide me some feedback</u>. For future twice annual (December & May) newsletters, I am considering not only forwarding them to you via email, but also providing a link to my page on the DKH website. Hopefully, this would provide an opportunity to connect with folks who have been lost in the past decade. Let me know what you think.
