Here is a bit of information about the scholarship requirements:

Distributions from the fund shall be used to make scholarship grants to students enrolled in the Physical Education Teacher Program within the Division of Kinesiology and Health at the University of Wyoming. To be eligible for this scholarship award an applicant must be a full-time student, have financial need as defined by FAFSA, and have a cumulative university GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale) or greater. Preference shall be given to a student who is a Wyoming resident.
