If restitution of rights is sought against a creditor.

2.37.1. Emperor Antoninus to Prunicus.

Since you yourself acknowledge that you made a contract with Zenodora, a minor under twenty-five years of age, and that you were unable to show to the honorable praetor that she was enriched by the contract, you understand that she was rightly restored to her rights.

Given May 2 (214).

2.37.2. Emperor Gordian to Gaianus.

If, as you allege, you, a minor, received money loaned upon interest, and that it was not used for your benefit, you can, in the customary manner, ask the aid of restitution against the due bill, by which you obligated yourself on that account.¹ Promulgated October 5 (238).
