5.66.1. Emperors Severus and Antoninus to Claudius Herodianus.

Those who at Rome have three living children whose status is not doubtful, and those who in Italy have four children, and those who in the provinces have five children are excused from managing a guardianship or curatorship.

Promulgated April 5 (203).

5.66.2. Emperor Antoninus to Marcellus.

A daughter who is dead does not count in the number of those necessary for an excuse from municipal burdens; nor are grandchildren, whose father is living, counted in such number since they serve to excuse the father himself. Given June 13 (213).
