Concerning the sale of things held in common by the fisc and private persons.
(De venditione rerum fiscalium cum privatis communium.)

10.4.1. Emperor Alexander to Victor.

The rule is that whenever the fisc owns even the smallest portion of a property, the whole is sold by my procurators, but only a part of the price should be turned into the treasury and the rest should be paid to the owners of the remaining portions. 1.

Therefore, summon the purchaser of the lands, concerning which you sent your petition, before his judge, to set up his defenses, if he has any.

C. 4.52.2 and note. The owners of the portions not belonging to the fisc, could, according to this rescript, sue the purchaser for their portion of the purchase price.
