This sample degree plan is a guide for course work in the major. • Course sequencing may need to be altered if ACT or Math Placement scores require a student to take pre-college courses before taking required math or English courses. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review course descriptions in the *University Catalog* and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly.

University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. • University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to UW's University Studies Program requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more)

Spanish: Culture, Lit, and Cinema Program notes:

O A study abroad experience is highly recommended for the junior year and students should consider taking SPAN 3070 (Intensive Spanish Abroad) whenever it is offered in a summer semester. Consult with an academic advisor about which programs and courses to take in the sophomore year to prepare.

* Students majoring in Spanish: Culture, Literature, and Cinema must take 31 semester hours of Spanish course work beyond SPAN 2030, which is taken in third semester of the program. This includes the required courses (2040, 2140, 3030/3050, 3040, 3140, 3100/3110/3120) plus an additional 12 hours of electives above SPAN 2030.
