* The instructional faculty is defined as all those members of the instructional/research staff who are employed full-time and whose major assignment (at least 50%) is instruction (including released time for research) – regardless of whether they are formally designated “faculty” or permanent faculty. Instructional faculty includes members on sabbatical leave and replacement faculty for faculty on leave without pay. Most research and clinical faculty are not included.
