Preceptors Teaching & Learning Modules - Preceptor Self-Assessment: Jump Start Continuing Professional Development

- 3. Choose "CEI" within the submenu Taskbar
- 4. Click on "Connect to CEI Account" which takes you to the CEI Preceptor Education page

For those of you who may not know all of us with the UWSoP Experiential Program, we would like to take this opportunity to introduce ourselves.

Our Experiential Education Program Director is Janelle Krueger, M.S., RPh. Janelle is a UWSoP alumnus from the class of 1992. After graduation, Janelle completed a 2-year residency at University of Kansas Medical Center and a Master of Science degree in Hospital Pharmacy Administration from University of Kansas. Prior to coming to UW in 2005, she was a supervisor in a hospital in Tucson, AZ (4 years) and a faculty member at Auburn University Harrison School of Pharmacy (7 years). Besides directing the entire Experiential Program, Janelle oversees the P1 Introduction to Pharmacy Practicum course, as well as the P2 Intermediate Pharmacy Practicum course. She also manages both the P2 Introduction to Community and Hospital Pharmacy rotations.

Antoinette Brown, RPh is also a class of 1992 alumnus from the UWSoP. Antoinette worked for over ten years as a retail pharmacist and owned her own pharmacy for part of that time. She also worked for over eight years at the Wyoming Department of Health managing the Wyoming Medicaid Pharmacy program. She became the Coordinator of Experiential Education at the UWSoP in 2013. Antoinette's primary focus is preparing P3 students for their fourth year professional rotations and overseeing the P4 students in their final year of schooling.

Dave Bruch, PharmD, RPh, received his Bachelor's degree in Mathematics and Science from the University of Wyoming in 1998. He received his Doctor of Pharmacy degree from University of Wyoming in 2010. After working in a community pharmacy for two years, Dr. Bruch joined the UWSoP faculty to oversee the Pharmacy Practice lab. He also assists in the Physical Assessment and Patient/Professional Interactions laboratories and also teaches the Dose Form class. Dave's primary role within the experiential team is to assist with preceptor development activities, including site visits.

The Experiential Program's Office Associate is JoAnn Rule. JoAnn has worked for the program for six years and has been with the UWSoP for 11 years. She keeps the students and the program on track by maintaining student files and rotation site contract files, entering availability for rotations, processing preceptor reimbursement payments, and maintaining E*Value student documentation, site and preceptor information. She also assists Janelle, Antoinette and Dave as needed, as well as general School of Pharmacy staff duties.
