### Preceptors Core Modules- Modules 1-4, Focus on Module #3: Giving Experiential Students Constructive Feedback

CE through the Collaborative Education Institute (CEI). This activity will provide you with 0.5 Hrs of CE, as well as tips on how to give effective feedback. This brief session will also provide you with skills to overcome barriers to providing effective feedback to your students.

CEI can be accessed directly by current preceptors through E\*Value, the rotation management system used by UWSoP.

1. Access the E\*Value login page via the following link: <https://www.e-value.net>
2. Log in to your E\*Value account and click on the "Learning Modules" tab
3. Choose "CEI" within the submenu Taskbar
4. Click on "Connect to CEI Account" which takes you to the CEI Preceptor Education page
5. While there are many educational sessions available from CEI, to access the sessions listed above, click on the light green "Preceptors" icon and scroll down to either the "Core Modules" or "Teaching & Learning" section. You can register for free and complete the CE by following the on-screen prompts.
